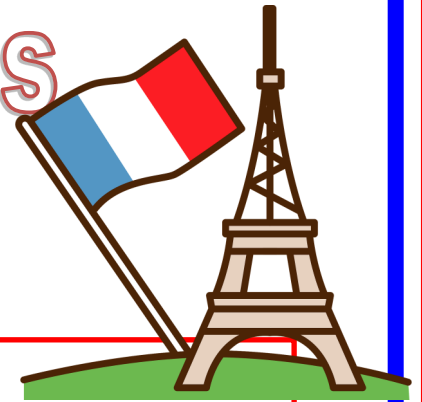


Primary Languages at Clockhouse

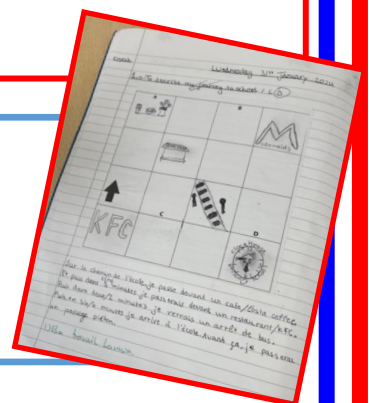
Year 4: In Year 4 French, students embarked on an exciting

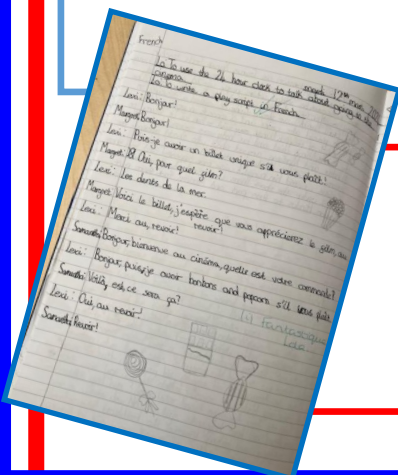
French!
