

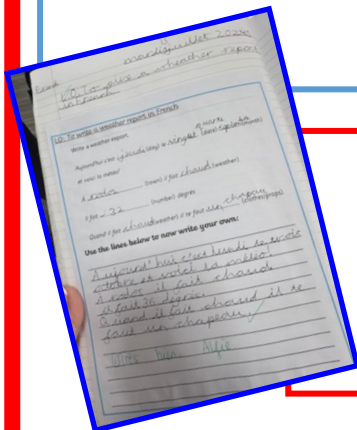
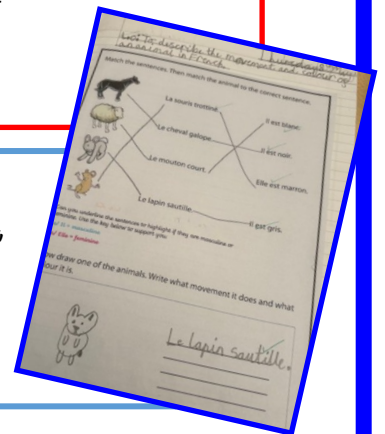
Primary Languages at Clockhouse



Bienvenue to our Primary Languages newsletter!

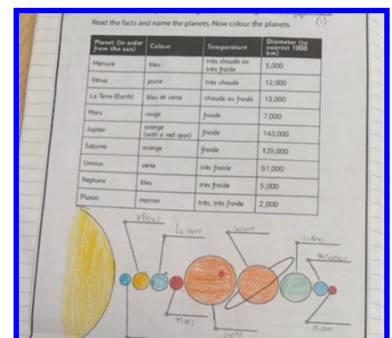
We are thrilled to begin a new term filled with exciting opportunities in Primary Languages. This term, pupils will continue exploring French through engaging lessons and year group specific activities that bring the language and culture to life. It is more than just learning words; it is about experiencing the joy of language learning in meaningful ways. learning a new language but also about immersing ourselves in a new world and

Year 3: In Year 3 French, students learned through the story *Jack and the Beanstalk*. They explored vocabulary linked to vegetables and plant growth, using storytelling to support their language development in a fun and engaging way. understanding of the natural world.



Year 4: Our students are focusing on writing weather reports using their prior knowledge of weather vocabulary. They learned to add descriptive adjectives to bring their reports to life and practised presenting different weather conditions across regions. This unit helped build confidence in sentence structure while encouraging creative and accurate language use.

Year 5: In Year 5 French, students have been learning about the solar system. They have practised using connectives to join sentences and have described the planets, including their features and distances from the sun. This topic has helped develop both vocabulary and sentence structure.



Year 6: In Year 6 French, students wrote their own milkshake recipes using key vocabulary, verbs, and instructional language. They then followed their recipes to make the milkshakes, combining practical skills with purposeful language learning.
