

You told us...!

Thank you to all those who completed our most recent questionnaire. We received 169 responses out of a parent population of over 1000.

You told us...

That you would like to see the Key Stage 1 playground improved to ensure a better play experience for the children in Year 1 and 2.

Our response...

This is something that we were already thinking about and we have made some changes to this area. The children have particularly enjoyed the new sandpit! We are in the process of making further plans which we hope the children will enjoy using.

95% of you agree that your child enjoys their learning

You asked us...

To consider using public transport to get children to sporting events rather than asking families to do this.

'Clockhouse does an amazing job of helping my child learn in a supportive environment. The teachers are dedicated Activities make learning fun and exciting. My child feels listened to. My child is happy at Clockhouse!'

Our response...

Following your feedback, we have begun to do this where possible and where we believe the children are of an age where they can manage this. We are also trying to ensure letters are sent out as early as possible if we are asking families to help us, We really are grateful for your help with this but know we are asking a lot.

97% of you agree that your child feels safe at school.

'Clockhouse makes learning exciting, supports every child individually and feels like a second home for my daughter.'

A small number of you said...

You would like to see more clubs, particularly for the children in the younger years.

Our response...

We do consider this but we are also mindful that the school day is already a long time for the youngest children. A lot of clubs run at lunchtime and as far as possible we try to ensure these are equitable for all. It is important to remember that our staff give their time freely to run these clubs at no cost to families so we do have to be ked by them to an extent.

You asked us...

To ensure the children study all religions throughout the year rather than concentrating on just one.

'Generally a fantastic group of staff that work hard in supporting the whole family and educating children no matter their circumstances or abilities.'

Our response...

Our Religious Education curriculum is very prescriptive. Unlike other areas of the curriculum, we have very little autonomy over what the children study and when as we have to follow the agreed syllabus. By the end of Year 6 all religions are studied.

100% of you agree that you know what your child is learning at school.
