School Aims

- To provide leadership and management which focuses on raising standards and promoting the personal development and well-being of all members of the school community.

Introduction

At Clockhouse Primary School we expect all children to wear school uniform in order to create a sense of community. By wearing the school uniform our children are given a sense of identity and belonging to our school. We want our children to look smart when at school and feel proud to wear their school uniform.

Our Uniform

Our uniform policy is outlined below. We ask and expect all our children to wear a school jumper or cardigan with our school logo. This can be purchased through the school's online uniform shop or can be acquired through the schools No Cost Uniform Shop (see below for more information about these options). The school also commissions a number of other items which carry the school's logo which can also be worn and purchased / acquired as above. However these items can also be purchased from many high street stores or supermarkets and do not need to carry the school's logo.

Our School Uniform is as follows:

- Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- White polo shirts (logo optional)
- Grey / dark shorts or long trousers
- Grey / dark skirt or pinafore dress
- Blue and white check dress
- White or dark coloured socks

- Blue / Black / Grey tights
- Sensible shoes, not boots (preferably without laces)

PE Kit

- White t-shirt (logo optional)
- Royal blue shorts
- Blue / Grey (logo optional) / dark tracksuit
- Plimsolls

The children in the Nursery do not need a PE kit.

Logoed and fashion items should not be worn as this is not in line with the school uniform expectations above.

The school will provide a separate PE kit for children representing the school when taking part in competitive sport.

Where to get uniform from

All uniform with a logo and some other parts of the uniform can be purchased through the school's online uniform shop or can be acquired through the schools No Cost Uniform Shop (see below for more information about these options). items (without the school logo) can be purchased from many high street stores or supermarkets.

The school also offers a No Cost Uniform Shop. Access to this provision is ongoing but uniform from here can be ordered online at any time. The No Cost Uniform Shop is also open after school once a month for browsing and acquiring items.

Hair, Jewellery and Accessories

The following expectations apply across the school:

- Hairstyles should be appropriate for school. All long hair (shoulder length or longer) should be tied back. We ask that headbands or hair bobbles are kept to a discreet minimum and as far as possible in royal blue - neither large bows nor headbands with decorative pieces should be worn.
- Brightly dyed hair is not allowed.
- No jewellery is to be worn to school except for a watch and only if absolutely necessary small, plain studs if children have pierced ears. These need to be covered by parents / carers or the children themselves with tape for PE.
- Watches can be analogue or digital. Smart watches are not allowed to be worn at school.
- Nail varnish and false nails should not be worn in school.

Other items

Children need a coat for school, school bag, water bottle (filled with water only), wellies for Foundation Stage and OPAL and in the summer need a sunhat. School bags need to be kept small so that they can fit on school pegs or in lockers. The school will inform parents / carers should the children require anything else.

All items brought to school are done so at their own risk, we therefore suggest that no designer, precious or expensive items are brought into school. The school cannot take responsibility for these or other items should they get lost or broken.

Inclusivity

As a school, we are sensitive to the needs of different cultures, races and religions and act reasonably in accommodating these needs, without compromising important school policies, such as school safety or discipline. When writing and implementing the policy, the school has given due regard to its obligations under the Human Rights Act 1998 and the Equality Act 2010 and works hard to ensure that policy is fully inclusive at all times.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items.

The Role of Governors

The governing body supports the Headteacher and the wider school in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school Uniform Policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

Policy and practice will be adapted in accordance with review findings.
